WITH St Patrick's Day coming up, nostalgic stories of Ireland and the plight those who left her shores are flying off the shelves. One to consider might be 'My Ireland', in which Ballina-born Margaret Connor looks back on her early life in Mayo and Dublin, capturing 1950s Ireland from her own particular perspective.

Connor spent her childhood on a small farm close to Ballina, leaving for the Capital as a teen to work in the hotel business. From Dublin, she emigrated to the US, where she studied at Harvard and the University of Chicago before going on to build a successful career in Silicon Valley.
